5. Hon. Bowls Secretary (Jean Webb) -

a) Report –

Indoor Season 2024/25

Men's County League (NCIBA) - 'A' Team (Division 1) – Played 10 games out of 12, won 5 and lost 5 and lay in third place with 37 points, 5.5 points behind second place Gallow 'A' and 4.5 points ahead of Acle 'A'.

'B' Team (Division 3) – Played 11 games, won 9 and lost 2 and lay top of the division with 54 points, 1.5 points ahead of Acle 'C'. All to play for with one game to play.

'C' Team (Division 4) – Played 13 games, won 6 and lost 7 and lay middle of the division with 41 points, 11.5 points behind Lynnsport 'B' and 4 points ahead of Shotford 'B'. Let's hang on in there with one game to play.

Last Sunday we played the Norfolk Past Presidents and again we came out the winners 123 shots to 79. We had two top rinks on the day Tom Hewkin, John Nash, Alan Coombe and Stephen Ramsbottom, Barry Layton and June Meadows.

- 6. Hon. League Secretary's Report (Keith Richards) The following written report was read out by Bob Smith:

The usual problem remains with 7 teams who have 25 games to catch up so we can finish within the playing season. Forms for the next season 2025/26 will be available by the end of March. Please return them by the end of June.

Any team not entering or player not competing in the league they were in 2024/25 season please let us know, this is especially important for those in the Vets league. I have already been informed that three players or one team is probably going to withdraw which will mean you cannot work out who you will be with next season.
